RED NOSE DAY SERVICE

On Friday 24th June at 10.30am, you are invited to a special Red Nose Day service at St Michael's.

In 1988, The Red Nose Day concept was adopted by SIDS and Kids

organisations around Australia. The first Red Nose Day was successful, with around one million red noses sold and about \$1.3 million raised. that

organisers decided to make Red Nose Day an annual event.

Red Nose Day is held on the last Friday in June and is the major

fundraiser for SIDS and Kids. SIDS and Kids is dedicated to saving the lives of children and babies during birth infancy pregnancy, childhood. Sadly each year over



4,300 babies and children die suddenly and unexpectedly from sudden infant death syndrome, stillbirth, fatal sleeping accidents and accidental death. Over 50% of these deaths still have no known cause. SIDS and Kids works to change all through the provision of education. bereavement support

> services and funding vital research into stillbirth, infant death sudden syndrome and safe sleeping practices. SIDS and Kids relies almost totally on the support of

the community.

REV. DAVID RYRIE

David Ryrie, who died aged 94 on the 10th of January, was a man who combined modesty with great dignity and a warm and generous spirit with a strong sense of decency and principle.

Born a twin in Winchelsea Victoria, his ultimate goal was to enter the Ministry of the Presbyterian Church and in 1938 he was accepted to begin training for that

profession. In 1942 he entered St Andrew's Theological Hall, Sydney, and spent three years there.

During his Theological Hall course David was a home mission student in the parish of Blacktown, from which charge he went as minister of the Presbyterian Church to Queanbeyan. He was ordained there on the 15th November, 1945. In 1946 he married Edna Garden, a teacher in As Queanbeyan. an ordained minister he went with Edna to Brighton-le-Sands in 1947, followed by Inverell in 1955, and then to St Andrew's Kirk, Ballarat, in 1962. His final parish was Coburg, where he remained from 1971 until his retirement in 1986.

A constant student and deep thinker, David had an intellectually rigorous approach to preaching. However, he saw his primary role as one of caring for people.

He retired from the Ministry at the end of 1985, and in January 1986 he moved to Mt Macedon, where he lived in a cottage on the property of his daughter, Helen, and

son-in-law, Peter Murdoch.

Until just before his 90th birthday David lived a very active and full life, driving to Melbourne to St Michael's Uniting Church, Collins Street, each Sunday and to Rotary meetings each Wednesday. David Ryrie was an inspiration to many people throughout his long life. He eschewed material wealth and the glory of high office in the Church, preferring to live simply and to serve God to the best of his ability.

He died peacefully and with dignity in the manner in which he had lived.


