THE MONTH OF MAHLER

Gustave Mahler composed some of our greatest classical music. He led an inspiring life of trauma and triumph and for the month of May, Dr Macnab will share the influence of Mahler with the church.

Born in 1860, Mahler became a well-known conductor and performed at some of the world's most famous opera houses. In

contrast, his own compositions did not gain significant popularity until well after his death in 1911. Since his music was discovered by a new generation of listeners in 1945,

Mahler has become one of the most frequently performed and recorded of all composers. He composed nine breath-taking symphonies and became famous for the unequalled amount of expression and ardour with which he wrote his music. Today, we listen to Mahler's music in awe and realise that he did indeed "embrace everything." In his works,

we hear turbulent storms, heavenly peace and roaring thunder. In his brazen melodies and lush harmonies, we hear the work of a genius. With his groundbreaking innovations and techniques, Mahler heralded the end of Romanticism and the arrival of the Modern Era of classical music. Dr Macnab invites you to join him as he speaks "about the Mahler who

has inspired me [...] his impact on religion. His significance to psychoanalysis. His disturbing insights into life."

Chancellor Alex Chernov, and has long been acknowledged as one of Australia's foremost children's choirs.

The concert commemorates the UN International Year of Forest, and proceeds will go towards Wildlife Victoria. It will begin at 12.15pm – 12.45pm, and entry will be a gold coin donation.

WHAT IS KFOG?

The Kindergarten Field Officers Group, or KFOG, is a group of field officers who meet fortnightly with Dr Macnab.

The group consists of Preschool Field Officers and Early Childhood Intervention professionals who work in a variety of children's services supporting children, parents and staff.

These field officers visit over 200 kindergartens across Melbourne, and are called to make visits when a

child, the parents or the kindergarten staff are having difficulties in meeting the needs of a child.

In these meetings they discuss their casework and explore different perspectives on the problems that they encounter in their work. Past discussions have included 'Parents in denial regarding the needs of their child,' and 'the different and varied characteristics of grief of parents of a damaged child.' KFOG encourages participants to reflect on their own

professional identity and their own aspirations and stresses in the workplace.

It is a dynamic, informative and thought provoking peer supervision experience, providing valuable professional development.

KFOG is facilitated by Dr Francis Macnab and is fully sponsored by St Michael's Uniting Church.
