### ST MICHAEL'S DAY

September 25<sup>th</sup> 2011 is St Michael's Day. St Michael's Day is a day that is celebrated all around the world and by all religions.

This day, in Melbourne, will begin at 7.45am with the St Michael's Day Breakfast, with special guest speaker Rachel Lowry. Rachel is the Director of Wildlife Conservation and Science at Zoos Victoria and she will be speaking on 'Fighting Extinction.'

At 9.30am the Rocks Ceremony will begin in the gardens on Collins Street. This year we will be honoured by His Eminence Zimwock Rinpoche, from the Jamchen Buddhist Centre, who will perform an animal blessing at the Rocks. Music will be provided by Fuefukuro, the vibrant young Japanese trio of flutes and taiko drum.

The Sunday Service will begin as usual at 10.00am and Dr Macnab will speak on 'From fairy tales to animal farm. How we can be more human in an animal kind of world. We do

need a New Faith.'

As a part of St Michael's day, each year St Michael's Uniting Church presents two people with "The St Michael's Medallions." The award is designed to recognise their work in the prevention of

violence, trauma and destructiveness or the promotion of growth, health and well-being.

This year our two recipients will be Dr Helen McCraken and Prof Paul Hemsworth. Helen McCraken is currently the Senior

Veterinarian at Melbourne Zoo.



Helen is recognised as an authority on the diagnosis and

management of mycobacterial infections in zoo animals, and has produced many important studies on animal disease and medicine. Prof Hemsworth is the director of the Animal Welfare Science Centre. He has built a research career studying the behaviour and welfare of farm and companion animals, particularly examining the influence of the social and physical environment on farm animal behaviour.

After service all are welcome to join us for The Colonnade Reception, where wine and cheese will be served in the courtyard and tea and coffee in St Michael's Hall.

But wait there's more! At 12.15pm, Ken Gosbell will present a special presentation,

in the Waratah room, on 'Living on the Edge – The tenuous Life of shorebirds.' This will be an enthralling presentation in which Ken will speak of his enthusiasm and passion for small birds of the world.

The day promises to provide something for everyone, so come along to this prestigious occasion!

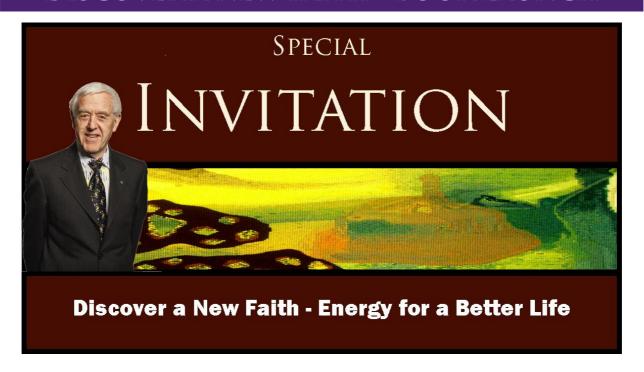
Greta has just released a new album, 'Grace', which is a tribute to how music connects with our passions and dreams. 'Grace' is in stores now.

### DISCOVER A NEW FAITH - BOOK LAUNCH



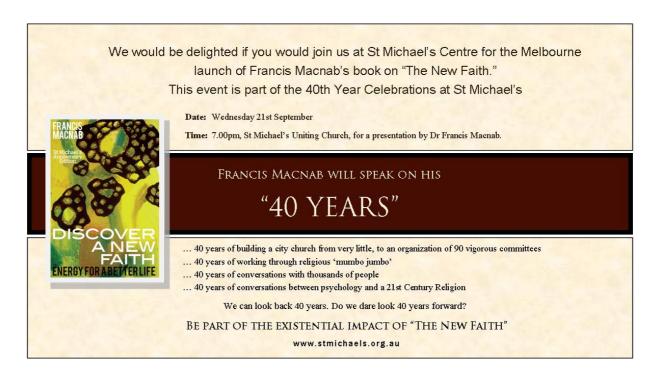
On Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> September, Dr Macnab's new book 'The New Faith' will be launched at St Michael's!

### JAMES MACREADY-BRYAN FOUNDATION



The James Macready Bryan Foundation were instrumental in getting a National Disability Insurance Scheme at the top of the Agenda for the Twenty-Twenty Conference three years ago, and have worked tirelessly to keep it on the political agenda.

The National Disability Insurance Scheme aims addressing the problem of the lack of appropriate facilities for young people with severe Acquired Brain Injury. Because of this lack of facilities, over 6,000 young people are destined for Nursing Homes.

The James Macready Bryan Foundation was established to provide support for the rehabilitation of James Macready Bryan and

others who are in circumstances. James incurred life changing injuries to his brain as a result of a fall in which he hit his head. As stated by the James Macready Bryan Foundation website 'when he fell, he also fell through a gap in our social support system, which provides very limited funding for the care and rehabilitation of acquired brain injury patients.' foundation aims to raise money and public awareness of the plight of many young people in the community who find themselves, through their disabilities, confined to unsuitable accommodation and with the inadequate opportunity to receive appropriate rehabilitation and care.

After three years of campaigning, the Council of Australian Governments has finally listened! Last year, James was installed in the first such building. The fundraising committee for JMBF raised \$50,000 last year, which went towards providing a special sensory room with equipment for the 10 residents. Two more such facilities are on the way in the Western suburbs and JMBF has high hopes to raise a further \$50,000 towards this cause.

St Michael's has always been very supportive of the JMBF and so have assisted in the campaign for a NDIS and the appropriate facilities. Thank you to all who have supported this cause and who participated in signing the petition for a National Disability Insurance Scheme.
