MUSIC FOR CONTEMPLATION

Golden Dreams - Javad Maroufi (1912-1993)

Javad Maroufi was born in Tehran (Iran) and studied western classical music alongside Persian classical music. He became one of the first composers to write for the piano in the traditional Persian style.

Amir Farid (Piano)

Moment Musicaux No. 3 – Franz Schubert (1797-1828)

The figure of Franz Schubert looms large in classical music, a musical equivalent of literary figures such as Shakespeare, Goethe and Rilke. Despite his short life of just 31 years – his music lives on with enduring popularity to this day. The six Musical Moments (Moment Musicaux) were published in the year of Schubert's death, 1828.

POSTLUDE

Toccata in G major – Th. Dubois (1837-1924)

This joyous toccata was written by the French organist and composer Théodore Dubois. Dubois was a noted composer, conductor, organist, pianist and music educator. He served as organist at Paris' Église de Madeleine for many years as well as directing the celebrated Paris Conservatoire.


Keep some room in your heart for the unimaginable.

proclaiming peace together in one song.



MUSICIANS IN CHURCH

Dr. Elyane Laussade

Here is what the New York Times has said about Elyane Laussade, "*a pianist with a polished technique. . . . dazzling power . . . and an impeccable sense of style.*" A graduate of the Juilliard School in New York City, pianist Elyane Laussade has delighted audiences on five continents for her imaginative and strongly individual playing. Since arriving in Australia, Elyane has established herself as one of Australia's finest pianists. She has appeared in the MSO's Metropolis Festival with Marcus Stenz and has been featured many times by ABC Classic FM and 3MBS in studio recordings and live broadcasts. She performed St. Saens' *Carnival of the Animals* with the MSO in Hamer Hall with pianist Benjamin Martin under the baton of Anthony Ingliss. Elyane performed De Falla's *Nights in the Gardens of Spain* with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra in the Myer Bowl in a concert which was broadcast across Australia. As a soloist, Elyane performs in Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, the USA and in Europe. She has toured Taiwan where she performed recitals in Taipei, Tainan, Chaiyi, and at the National Concert Hall in Taichung. Elyane was also invited to perform at the first recorded performance at the Elizabeth Murdoch Recital Hall in the new Melbourne Recital Centre which aired on the ABC television program "Catalyst."

Alex Owens

Through his performance, his writing, and his work in arts management, Alexander Owens strives to create emotional, impactful experiences. Following his passion for music through recital performance, choral singing, composing and beyond, he found his drive in the ways music so deeply connects with people, provokes thought, and creates change. 2019 saw Owens premiere new choral works and Lied, along with an exciting commission with the Arts Centre Melbourne for the 5x5x5 project. With the Austral Salon he performed a new recital program, "The Artist's Cry", focusing on life, love and loss through the music of Schubert, Ibert and Rachmaninov.

Through the University of Melbourne's IgniteLAB professional incubator, Owens created the inaugural Staff Choir, which saw over 60 staff members from across the University come together in song across May and June. He continues to regularly perform with the Australian Chamber Choir, Polyphonic Voices and Melbourne Symphony Orchestra Chorus. Owens is currently undertaking his undergraduate studies with Mr. Stephen Grant at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music (University of Melbourne), where he briefly studied mathematics before dedicating himself to music. He is a proud alumni of the Victorian College of the Arts Secondary School, where he studied voice with Mr. Timothy Reynolds and composition with Dr. Anthony Lyons. He continues to be involved with the rich artistic community that the school creates. Recent awards and prizes include the 2017 VCAA Margaret Schofield Memorial Scholarship and 2017 MSV David Henkels Award for composition, and the VCASS/Austral Salon Outstanding Soloist Award. Owens is generously supported by the Rae Banger Music Bursary and CG McWilliam Bequest.
