

CONTEMPORARY READING

"A New Pentecost" by Michael Morwood

There is a new Pentecost.

Or maybe it should be called a "renewed" Pentecost – an affirmation that the Mystery we call "God" is actively present in all places, in all people, at all times, and a recognition that our world desperately needs religious belief that connects people into trusting and compassionate relationships rather than religious belief that divides and breeds fear and suspicion.

Pentecost, in the perspective of an everywhere God, becomes an Aha! moment for the initial followers of Jesus. These men and women reflected on Jesus' life, his teaching, his death and the fact that death was not the end of him. They remembered him as someone who totally opened himself to allowing the Spirit of God to move in his life. They saw that the Spirit of God had been at work in all he said and did. Only through contemplating the Jesus they knew, did the wonderful insight about the human condition dawn on them - that all human beings bring God's presence to visibility.

They realized that this is what life and connectedness with God and with one another is all about! Jesus revealed to us who we really are a life form giving God a wonderful way of coming to expression! All the time this Spirit of God has been with us and we were too blind or too distracted or too badly taught to recognize this Presence in us! Jesus opened our eyes and our minds!

Now we understand!

We, too, are bearers of the Spirit of God. We have to give expression to this in the way we relate with one another just as Jesus did for us.

Madrigal – Philippe Gaubert (1879-1941)

Philippe Gaubert began his musical career as a flautist, but later in his career became an eminent conductor. in 1919 he became the conductor of the Paris Opéra and simultaneously the Orchestre de la Société des Concerts du Conservetoire. Shortly before his death, a public garden was named in his honour near the river Lot in the town of Cahors. Whilst impossible to describe the impact and effect of some music with words, this music whilst serene conveys both a sense of mysticism coupled with a feeling of searching for resolution.

Adagio and Allegro from 'The Occasional Oratorio'

– G.F. Handel (1685-1759) transcribed for organ by W.T. Best This jubilant overture by Handel is a fitting piece to celebrate Pentecost and the birth of the church. Originally composed for orchestra, the work was transcribed for the organ by the 19th century English organ virtuoso, William Thomas Best.

POSTLUDE

Toccata – Joseph Jongen (1873-1953)

There are many wonderful and memorable toccatas for the organ. These include works by such luminaries as Bach, Widor, Frescobaldi and many others. This toccata by the great Belgian virtuoso, Joseph Jongen, was completed in its final form in February 1953 only months before the composer's death. It uses extremely rich and colourful harmony as well as exploring the full power of the organ. It is regarded as one of the most technically difficult works in the repertory, and as such is seldom performed and remains little known.

MUSICIAN IN CHURCH AND ONLINE

Peter Sheridan

Innovative and creative flutist, performer and teacher, Peter Sheridan has collaborated with some of the world's leading composers, commissioning more than sixty works for the modern flutes. A passionate specialist on the low flutes, he has promoted these instruments in concert and master classes, appearing at the National Flute Association and British Flute Society conventions, as well as festivals in Japan, Holland, Canada and Australia. Mr. Sheridan has performed with the Los Angeles Flute Quartet, Hollywood Studio Symphony, Australian National Academy of Music Orchestra, Mannes Camerata, Aspen Festival Orchestra, Australian Pops Orchestra and for the Grand Canyon Chamber Music Festival. He recently had a hyper-bass flute created that spans 32 feet and plays down to C0, which is featured on the new recording, "Monologues and Dialogues"

(Move Records). Peter has presented interactive workshops, master classes and seminars for composers which explore the unique sounds, sights and possibilities of the modern-day low flutes. These educational tours have brought him around Australia and throughout areas of the United States, both performing and teaching to students and colleagues of all age groups.

Mr. Sheridan is lecturer of flute for the Monash University School of Music and director of the University Flute Ensemble. As a Woodwinds Instructor at Donvale Christian College, he directs the flute ensembles and the Senior Concert Band. He holds degrees and certifications from Mannes College, University of Arizona, Goldsmith's College (London), and completed graduate work at UCLA. Peter has served on the music faculties of La Sierra University, Santa Monica College, and El Camino Colleges in California (USA). Flute studies have been with Sheridon Stokes, Jean Louis Kashy, Judith Mendenhall, Thomas Nyfenger, Bonnie Lichter, and Clare Hoffmann. His various flutes can be heard on Move, Sarabande, Warner Bros. Latina, Albany, and Innova record labels.
