Allegro from the Concerto in D Major KV 428 Il gardellino – Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741)

Antonio Vivaldi, a contemporary of both J.S. Bach and G.F. Handel earned himself the nickname, The Red Priest, due to the fact he was both a redhead and a Roman Catholic priest. This concerto, Il gardellino, or in English, The Goldfinch celebrates bird song and nature, appropriate for the season of spring.

In the days before the internet, the airplane, the radio or even railways, it is extraordinary that the great German composer J.S. Bach even knew the name of his contemporary Italian composer, Antonio Vivaldi. Bach was a great fan of Vivaldi, and arranged several of his violin concertos for himself to perform on the organ. In a strange twist of fate, Bach's arrangements for organ became widely known, however, many assumed that Bach had also composed the works, and it wasn't until the 20th century that many of Vivaldi's manuscripts came to life, proving what many had suspected, that they were the work of Vivaldi.
