It is the final movement of Widor's 5<sup>th</sup> organ symphony (a symphony written for the organ alone). It is a much-loved favourite of many.

Berceuse de Jocelyn - Benjamin Goddard (1849-1895)

Despite writing a large number of works including several symphonies and 8 operas, the French born composer is little known today. This sublime Berceuse comes from Goddard's 1888 opera Jocelyn.

Le Colibri – Ernest Chausson (1855-1899)

Le Colibri, or, The hummingbird is from the pen of the French composer, Ernest Chausson. It is one of a set of 7 melodies published in 1882. Although originally studying law, Chausson lost interest and pursued a career in music. Showing great potential, his life was cut short aged 44 after a tragic bicycle accident.
