This calm and surreal music provides an excellent background for meditation. The French composer Claude Debussy is without rival in the fluidity of his piano writing in particular.

POSTLUDE

"À Chloris" - Reynaldo Hahn (1874-1947)

This work dates from the early 20th century and was penned by the Venezuelan born, but naturalized French composer, Reynaldo Hahn. Hahn is today best remembered for his vocal songs but wrote a great deal of instrumental music as well. MUSIC FOR CONTEMPLATION

Nocturne - Margaret Southerland (1897-1984)

Margaret Southerland was born in Adeliade and is one of a number of celebrated female composers born around the same time. Sutherland was a protégé of the great English composer Arnold Bax and wrote a great deal of music. The Unitversity of Melbourne conferred Sutherland with an honorary doctorate in 1969. Madrigale – Ottorino Respighi (1879-1936)

This charming Madrigale or Madrigal is part of a set of 6 pieces dating from 1906). Despite living a relatively short life, Respighi remains arguably one of the most important and influential European composers of the first half of the 20th century.

POSTLUDE

A Trumpet Minuet - Alfred Hollins (1865-1942)

The blind English organ virtuoso and composer Alfred Hollins earned the nickname of 'Alfred the great'. Hollins visited Melbourne in 1904 performing both at St. Michael's and the Melbourne Town Hall. The largest of the 3 trumpet stops at St. Michael's is used for this work. Rhys Boak (Organ)
