Music Notes

Nocturne

– Lili Boulanger (1893-1918)

Lili Boulanger, sister of noted composer and composition teacher Nadia Boulanger, was the first woman composer to win the Grand Prix de Rome. Her work was praised for its colourful harmony and instrumentation and her teachers included Gabriel Fauré, who was greatly impressed by her skills.

Nocturne

Originally a Jazz standard known as ‘Harlem Nocturne’ written in 1939, this work has been reimagined by the Melbourne based composer and pianist, Joe Chindamo.

Litanies

– Jehan Alain (1911-1930)

Jehan Alain, one of three siblings who all become important figures in 20th century music, was sadly killed in the second world war at age 29. Whilst his music can accurately be described as both Modernist and Modal, it is also intensely spiritual, the majority of his output being liturgical and organ music. His musical voice is one of great originality and innovation.
