

Beau Soir-Claude Debussy (1862-1918)

Claude Debussy was greatly influenced by the beauty of the natural world and the environment. This sublime song is titled 'Beautiful Evening' and reflects the beauty of a still, moonlit night.

Le Colibri – Ernest Chausson (1855-1899)

Le Colibri (The Hummingbird) is from the pen of the French composer, Ernest Chausson. It is also inspired by the environment and wonder of the natural world. Although originally studying law, Chausson lost interest and pursued a career in music. Showing great potential, his life was cut short after a tragic bicycle accident at age 44.
