

Acknowledgement of Country


The land on which St Michael's stands is the sovereign and unceded country of the Wurundjeri people of the Kulin Nation.


Offering Prayer

'Vaga luna che inargenti' – Vincenzo Bellini (1801-1835)

Published in 1838, the same year that the congregation that would eventually become St Michael's was founded, this aria is a celebration of nature, the environment and love.
